

VENUE AND DURATION OF COURSE:

East Surrey College, Gatton Point, London Road, Redhill, RH1 2JX, 2 years Full-time, 3 days per week.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

5 GCSE grades 9-4 (A*-C) including English and Maths or BTEC Level 2 Diploma Merit/Distinction and GCSE English & Maths grades 9-4 (A*-C).

WHAT QUALIFICATIONS WILL I GET?

UAL Level 3 Extended Diploma in Creative Media and Technology.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course provides a practical approach to gaining the skills needed for this profession. You will need enthusiasm for the industry and the course will help you develop your development skills and creative thinking for post-production & production work within industry.

The first year is a general introduction to the different skills and roles there are, this will cover technical and creative aspects including 3D & 2D animation, sound production, programming, digital graphics, computer platforms and concept design. The second year will allow you to directly develop and produce a varied portfolio that will support employment or study at a higher level.

- Specialist Study in Creative Media Production
- Extended Project in Creative Media Production

PROJECTS COVERED:

- Project 1 – Introduction to Creative Skills
- Project 2 – Creative Arts
- Project 3 – Alpha Development
- Project 4 – Final Major Project

TYPE OF ASSESSMENT:

Assessment will be a combination of coursework and practical assignments/presentations set within each project.

EQUIPMENT NEEDED:
