

VENUE AND DURATION OF COURSE:

East Surrey College, Gatton Point, Redhill, RH1 2JX, 1 year Full-time.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

5 GCSEs grade 9-4 (A*-C) including English and Maths or: BTEC NQF Level 2 Extended Certificate/BTEC QCF Level 2 Diploma Merit/Distinction and GCSEs grade 9-4 (A*-C) in English and Maths

WHAT QUALIFICATIONS WILL I GET?

Level 3 Extended Diploma in Protective Services. During Year one, students will achieve a Level 3 Foundation Diploma in Uniformed Protective Services equivalent to 1.5 A Levels. During Year two, students will achieve the full Level 3 Extended Diploma in Uniformed Protective Services equivalent to 3 A Levels.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is disciplined, practical, and offers a wide range of subject areas that will prepare students for careers within the Uniformed Public Services. These include the Armed Forces, Emergency Services, HM Prison Service, the Civil Service and the Coast Guard. The course includes a number of trips and visits that are designed to support learning within the classroom and enhance the student experience. Trips include visiting the Houses of Parliament, a self-guided crime tour of London, walking expeditions, the Imperial War Museum and land-based activities such as climbing and orienteering.

The course is continuously assessed through assignments, practical project tasks and case studies. It uses practical activities, presentations and involvement with local Public Services wherever possible. You will also take part in related work experience or a work-based project during non-college days. Uniform is mandatory.

UNITS/TOPICS COVERED:

Within the course, students will study topics such as health, diet, leadership and teamwork, politics, expedition skills, discipline, fitness, war and terrorism, Human Rights, International Institutions, diversity and equal opportunities. Throughout the course, you will have the opportunity to complete a first aid qualification, Level 1 Climbing qualification and a BCU 1* Canoe and Kayaking qualification.

TYPE OF ASSESSMENT:

BTEC is a portfolio-based assessment programme that allows students to submit coursework at specific dates throughout the academic year. Assessment comes in a range of forms and includes external examinations, reports, practical assessment and observation, class tests, presentations, discussion seminars and practical projects and coursework (There will be a 70/30 split with coursework making up the majority of the assessment). Students will be asked to meet stringent deadlines and only have one opportunity at each assessment.



EQUIPMENT NEEDED:

- You will need to purchase uniform items consisting of trousers, polo shirts, sweat tops, a waterproof jacket and black boots. Uniform can be purchased during enrolment.
- You will need pens and paper and relevant stationery to complete basic classroom tasks.
- You will also require basic expedition equipment (eg walking boots, mess tin and a rucksack). A full list of expedition equipment will be provided on induction.

WHERE CAN IT LEAD?

Passing the course will allow you to move on to a Public Services Level 3 Extended Diploma, or another Level 3 course within the College. It can also lead to a range of Public Service careers including law, outdoor education sector and health care. This qualification may also allow for progression to higher education at university.

COURSE FEE:

If you are under 19 on 31/08/2023, tuition is free. If you are 19 or over, please consult Client Services for advice and guidance on funding and eligibility.

Please be aware that there may be additional costs for equipment and educational visits. This information will be available from the curriculum staff at interview.
