#### **VENUE AND DURATION OF COURSE:**

East Surrey College, Gatton Point, London Road, Redhill RH1 2JX, 1 year Full-time.

#### **ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:**

Few formal qualifications, ideally 4 GCSEs grade 9-1 (A\*-G) or equivalent in English and Maths only. Students must have a positive school reference and attend a satisfactory interview.

#### **WHAT QUALIFICATIONS WILL I GET?**

Entry Level, Certificate and Diploma in Vehicle Systems Maintenance.

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

The IMI Entry Level Diploma assists you to embark on a career in vehicle repair; you will learn vehicle servicing and repair through a mixture of practical and theoretical tasks in our newly built and highly equipped motor vehicle workshop and classrooms. This course will allow you to learn, develop and practise the skills required for employment and/or career progression in the automotive industry.

#### **TYPE OF ASSESSMENT:**

All work is continually assessed by observation of practical tasks, as well as written tests.



**EQUIPMENT NEEDED:**

All students will be required to wear College uniform. Steel toe capped boots must be worn at all times when in the workshops. Students will also need to bring in stationery equipment such as pens, pencils, calculator, lever arch folder and recommended textbooks.

**WHERE CAN IT LEAD?**

This course provides a progression route to a Level 1 qualification with the potential for a career in the Motor Industry by means of further training, full time employment or an Apprenticeship.
