VENUE AND DURATION OF COURSE:

East Surrey College, Gatton Point, Redhill, RH1 2JX, 2 years Full-time, 3 days per week.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

5 GCSEs grades 9-4 (A*-C), including Art or Design Technology, English and Maths. Level 2 qualifications in Art & Design are also acceptable but must be assessed to be able to progress and have the aptitude to achieve a Level 3 Art & Design course. A portfolio of work is to be shown at interview.

WHAT QUALIFICATIONS WILL I GET?

- Art, Design & Media Level 3 Extended National Diploma

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course has a broad starting point and is designed for students who wish to find a specialist in an Art & Design subject. This course has pathways in the following areas:

- Fashion and Textiles
- Graphics, Illustration, Animation and Multimedia Design
- Three Dimensional Design
- Fine Art

This is a vocational alternative to the 'A' Level route offering a solid grounding for specialisation. This course is designed to teach the skills common to all Art & Design students. The first stage of this course is best described as 'basic training'. A broad introduction is very important before students specialise in one of four subject pathways in the second stage. It is designed to help identify the right direction/pathway for the individual student. This qualification provides UCAS points and is recognised by all Higher Level Art, Design and Media courses and employers. Our students have a very high success rate at entering degree and Higher National Diploma courses. We also provide all the support and guidance needed for the portfolio preparation for UCAS applications or job interviews. Mature students with or without formal qualifications are encouraged to apply.

At the end of each project, there is a formal assessment by portfolio and tutorial with formal feedback.

A broad range of general art materials, you will need to buy some materials, sketchbook, drawing and painting materials as well as a work box, a list will be issued.

WHERE CAN IT LEAD?

This course provides the progression route for a career in the creative industries of Art, Design and Media. This course mainly provides a progression to a higher level course at degree level subjects such as: Graphic Design, Fashion and Textiles, Illustration, Animation, Multimedia Design, Three Dimensional Design, Photography, Fine Art etc.
