VENUE AND DURATION OF COURSE:

East Surrey College, Gatton Point, Redhill, RH1 2JX, 2 years Full-time, 3 days per week.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

Five GCSEs grade 9-4 (A* - C) that include English and Maths or a Level 2 Diploma at Merit/Distinction and GCSE English and Maths grade 9-4 (A* - C).

WHAT QUALIFICATIONS WILL I GET?

- Year 1: UAL Level 3 Diploma
- Year 2: UAL Level 3 Extended Diploma

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This pathway prepares students for a potential career in the sound and music industry and offers a progression route to higher education. It offers exciting opportunities to learn professional production techniques working in professional sound studios and Mac Suites with Logic & Pro Tools. Students learn how to prepare for employment or self-employment within the creative industries. Mature students with or without formal qualifications are encouraged to apply.

- Principles of Performance and Production
- Critical Listening and Composition
- Music Industry and Professional Practice
- Critical and Contextual Awareness for Music
- Music Production / Performance in Context
- Developing Performance / Production Skills
- Exploration of Specialist Study
- Preparing for Progression in Music Performance / Production
- Extended Music Project

TYPE OF ASSESSMENT:

Formative assessment will take place during projects in one to one and group tutorials, peer assessment and presentations. At the end of each project a formal summative assessment and progress review will take place.

EQUIPMENT NEEDED:

Headphones and a 500GB (or larger) USB storage device are both essential.

WHERE CAN IT LEAD?

The course is equivalent to three 'A' Levels and will provide a pathway to further study at degree level or employment in the sound and music industry including: recording studios, radio stations, live sound, music management, film and television sound and any other area of media that incorporates audio
