- Dyslexia screening alongside recommended strategies for independent progress in learning
- Specialist support with hearing or visual impairments as well as speech and language needs

Financial Support

A helping hand if you need it

There are a number of financial support options available to you depending on your age, level of study and circumstances.

Under 19?

If you are under the age of 19 on 31 August 2022 and you meet the eligibility criteria, your course is FREE.

You may be required to pay a resource fee and educational visit costs, however financial support is available for those who need it (subject to family income level).

19 and Over?

Depending on the qualifications you have already gained, tuition and/or exam fees may be payable. If you are aged 19-23 on 31 August 2022 and are studying your first full Level 2 or Level 3 qualification, then you may not have to pay tuition or exam fees.

If you're 19+, you have not achieved a full Level 3 qualification and the course you are applying for is on the National Skills Fund (NSF) list, then you may also not have to pay tuition or exam fees.

For Level 2 qualification courses and below, you may not have to pay tuition or exam fees if you are unemployed and receiving a state benefit, or you are working and are on a low income (Exact criteria TBC by Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) in May 2022).

If you are aged 19+ studying a Level 3 qualification and are not entitled to any other waivers, you will normally have to pay course fees. Or if available, you can apply for an Advanced Learner Loan (applicable to adults studying at Level 3 or higher). The loans are managed by the Student Loans Company, and further information can be found on their website: www.slc.co.uk.

If you are using the Advanced Learner Loan to pay for an Access to HE course, once you have successfully completed your Higher Education course, the Student Loans Company will write off the amount outstanding on the loan.

Financial Support

Students from low income households, including those on benefits, may be eligible for financial support through one of our Bursary support schemes. Students who are classified as a vulnerable learner may also be eligible.

Following a needs assessment, students may be eligible for financial support towards; childcare costs, resource/materials fees, kit and uniform, essential educational visits, free school meals, travel expenses and more.

Application forms are available at www.esc.ac.uk or from our Student Bursary Adviser, who can provide detailed information relevant to you and will assess your application to see if you are eligible for financial support.



Functional Skills, Digital Skills and GCSE English or Maths

If you meet the residency criteria, these courses are normally offered free. Please contact our Client Services team for further information.



One-to-one support available with our Student Bursary Adviser who can give advice about student loans, funding, bursaries and more.



Confidential information and advice is available to help you manage your money and apply for financial assistance.

Finding the right course

Unlock your potential on a course you love

We offer courses across a range of subject areas at various levels to suit your strengths, taking you to the next level. This section is designed to help you find the right course.

Functional Skills

Functional Skills are the fundamental skills you need for work and your personal life. They can be studied as standalone qualifications or as a stepping stone to GCSEs and support progression to higher levels. You are eligible to study Functional Skills if you are:

- 16+, have left compulsory Full-time education or do not have an up-to-date English or Maths qualification at Level 2 (such as a GCSE)
- between the ages of 16-18 and are studying a Full-time course

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

If English isn't your first language, ESOL courses cover speaking, listening, reading and writing. You will be assessed before starting, to ensure you are placed on the right course level.

GCSEs

Good grades at GCSE level can make the difference when it comes to employment and opportunities for progression. They are the main qualifications taken by 14-16 year olds, and

are highly valued by schools, colleges and employers.

Maths and English are particularly valued by employers and are important to be able to progress onto higher levels.

Apprenticeships and NVQs

An NVQ is an industry related qualification that you may study at College or at work as part of an Apprenticeship. You will learn practical, work-related tasks to help you develop the skills and knowledge to do a job effectively. You will be assessed to see the areas that need to be developed to complete your qualification.

BTECs

BTECs are designed for those interested in a particular sector or industry, offering a mix of theory and practice learning, including an element of work experience or a work-related project and are equivalent to 3 A Levels.

You could study a BTEC at Level 2 or 3, either as a standalone course, alongside an academic qualification or as part of a wider programme (such as an Apprenticeship).

T Levels

A new qualification designed for 16-19 year olds, with a mixture of classroom learning and work placement. They follow GCSEs and are equivalent to 3 A Levels. See page 16 for more information.

Apprenticeships

What's an Apprenticeship?

Apprenticeships are designed for students of all age groups (16+) who have left Full-time education and are in employment. As an Apprentice, you will be employed by a company and earn a wage whilst you learn, build your skills and gain a nationally recognised qualification.

To start an Apprenticeship programme you will need to secure employment. Training is flexible, with the majority being completed 'on the job' and the rest provided by our team at College.

Who can become an Apprentice?

You can start an Apprenticeship if:

- You're aged 16+
- You live in England
- You're not in Full-time education

T-LEVELS

THE NEXT LEVEL QUALIFICATION

What are T Levels?

T Levels are new Level 3 courses following on from GCSEs and are equivalent to a Level 3 vocational study programme or studying 3 A Levels. These 2-year courses, have been developed in collaboration with employers and businesses so that the content taught meets the needs of industry and prepares you for work, further training or study.

T Levels offer you a mixture of college-based learning and 'on-the-job' experience during an industry placement of at least 315 hours (approximately 45 days).

Are T Levels right for you?

This next level qualification is right for you if you:

- have just finished your GCSEs
- want to get into a skilled job
- like a mixture of classroom and practical learning
- want the knowledge, skills and experience to get the job you want
- are interested in spending time with employers to try out different job roles

How do they work?

You'll spend 80% of your time in College and 20% on an industry placement where you'll gain the knowledge and skills employers are looking for and develop a better understanding of the workplace.

A new career-focused alternative to A Levels

T Levels consist of the following compulsory elements:


1. An approved technical qualification - core theory specialist skills and knowledge specific to your chosen occupation/career path.
2. An industry placement with an employer of at least 45 days - providing the knowledge and experience to progress to skilled employment, further study or a Higher Apprenticeship.
3. You will need 5 GCSEs grade 9-4 (A*-C) including English and Maths; or a Level 2 Diploma/Extended Certificate to apply at East Surrey College.

Can I get UCAS tariff points?

Yes. Your T Level will be worth UCAS points. You can use the qualification when applying for Higher Education.

What is the difference between T Levels and Apprenticeships?

T Levels and Apprenticeships are similar, they will be based upon the same standards which are designed by employers. However, an Apprentice spends most of their time in the workplace, learning on-the-job, whereas a T Level student will spend most of their time in College/College workshops.

Access to Higher Education

The Access to Higher Education Diploma is a nationally-recognised Level 3 qualification designed to prepare adults to study in Higher Education. If you are keen to get back into education after taking some time out, or you left school without the qualifications needed for University, then an Access to Higher Education course is for you.

At East Surrey College, we offer a range of Access diplomas in subjects within Health-related professions, Science and Social Work.


Our courses are designed to give you the skills and qualifications you need to apply for University.

As a student aged 19+, you may not have to pay upfront tuition fees and may be eligible to apply for the Advanced Learner Loan. The Advanced Learner Loan is managed by the Student Loans Company and is set up for students aged 19+ who want to study at Level 3 or higher. More information on eligibility for financial support and student loans can be found on page 8.

Things to note before you start

- You will need to wear a uniform as part of your course. You would need to buy this before you start
- You may need to pay for any external trips
- You may need to pay for additional training workshops



It gives a good grounding in a range of business skills, promotes creative thinking within a commercial context and develops a good understanding using theory and its application in practice. Entry Requirements: 2 A Levels (or equivalent) in a relevant subject and GCSEs grade 9-4 (A*-C) in English and Maths; or Level 3 Extended Diploma Merit/Distinction in a relevant subject and GCSEs grade 9-4 (A*-C) in English and Maths. Mature students with or without formal qualifications may have relevant experience and are encouraged to apply

Assessment: Portfolio of practical work and written assignments

Aimed at post A Level students as well as mature students with relevant experience or qualifications, this course is a required prerequisite for most University Level creative subject areas.

You will study a very broad range that includes painting and drawing as well as workshops in 3D, traditional and non-traditional skills. There is a focus on materials, processes and methods as you develop your own considered approach. You will need to be self-motivated as you will be set challenging work. The Foundation Diploma programme at Reigate School of Art has a reputation for ensuring individual care and attention to its students.

Support and guidance is provided for portfolio preparation for UCAS applications or job interviews. The Foundation Diploma qualification is nationally regulated by Ofqual and awarded by the University of the Arts London Awarding Body.

CREATIVE MEDIA

UAL* LEVEL 1 DIPLOMA

1 Year

Entry Requirements: 4 GCSEs grade 9-2 (A*-E) including English and Maths

Assessment: Portfolio of practical work

This course offers a broad introduction to Creative Media and is suitable for those with very basic previous practical experience.

You will explore a range of media skills whilst developing the personal skills and qualities needed for work to help you achieve your full potential.

- Still and moving image

YOUR NEXT STEPS

This course provides the progression route for a career in the Creative industries with employment at a Junior Assistant level, or within the wider commercial/creative based industries. CREATIVE MEDIA

UAL* LEVEL 2 DIPLOMA IN CREATIVE MEDIA PRODUCTION & TECHNOLOGY

1 Year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSEs grade 9-3 (A*-D) including English and Maths; or Level 1 Diploma Merit/Distinction and GCSEs grade 9-3 (A*-D) in English and Maths

Assessment: Portfolio of work

This course gives a broad introduction to the diversity of roles and responsibilities in the media sector and the personal and professional characteristics needed for a career in the Creative Media industry.

You will learn the basic understanding of sound as well as still and moving image. Improve and explore your skills and techniques, whilst developing the personal skills and qualities needed for further study or work.

2 Years

168 UCAS Points (Grade D)

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSEs grade 9-4 (A*-C) including English and Maths; or Level 2 Diploma Merit/Distinction and GCSEs grade 9-4 (A*-C) in English and Maths. Mature students with or without formal qualifications are encouraged to apply.

Assessment: Portfolio of work

This course is a vocational alternative to the A Level route and provides a practical approach to gaining the skills needed for progression into a career in the gaming or wider creative industry. It will introduce you to both the creative and technical aspects of computer games, animation and 3D modelling through a variety of creative project briefs.

- Animation (2D and 3D)
- 3D modelling
- Computer game platforms and technologies
- Sound production
- Programming
- Self directed final project

YOUR NEXT STEPS

This course aims to provide you with the necessary skills for employment in the Creative industry, or for progression to Degree Level study at other training institutions and Universities.

FILM & TV PRODUCTION

UAL* LEVEL 3 EXTENDED DIPLOMA IN CREATIVE MEDIA PRODUCTION & TECHNOLOGY

2 Years

168 UCAS Points (Grade D)

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSEs grade 9-4 (A*-C) including English and Maths; or Level 2 Diploma Merit/Distinction and GCSEs grade 9-4 (A*-C) in English and Maths. Mature students with or without formal qualifications are encouraged to apply

Assessment: Portfolio of work

This course is a vocational alternative to the A Level route and has been designed to develop the skills required for progression into a career in the Media industries or on to University level study.

You will learn different aspects of the Film & TV industry and gain an understanding of the general context of contemporary production.

Assessment: Portfolio of work

LEVEL 3 EXTENDED DIPLOMA

2 Years

168 UCAS Points (Grade D*D*D*)

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSEs grade 9-4 (A*-C) including English and Maths (creative subject beneficial); or BTEC Level 2 Extended Certificate Merit/Distinction and GCSEs grade 9-4 (A*-C) in English and Maths

Assessment: Coursework and computer based exams (externally set)

This course is aimed at you if you have an active interest in the creative industries such as fashion, music, film, visual arts, advertising, events, promotion and marketing. It gives a good grounding in a range of business skills, promotes creative thinking within a commercial context and develops a good understanding using theory and its application in practice. You will take part in work experience or a work based project during non-college days. This can be in collaboration with students in the Business department at ESC.

Alternatively this course can lead to further study across a range of Higher Education courses at ESC, such as the Sound and Music Production Certificate in Higher Education and Sound and Music Production Foundation Degree.
