UNDER 19?

If you are under the age of 19 on 31 August 2021 and you meet the eligibility criteria, your course is FREE.

You may be required to pay a resource fee and educational visit costs, however financial support is available for those who need it (subject to family income level).

19 AND OVER?

Depending on the qualifications you have already gained, tuition and/or exam fees may be payable.

If you are aged 19-23 (on 31 August of the year you start your course) and have not attained a Full Level 2 qualification (5 GCSEs 9-4/A*-C) or a Full Level 3 qualification (equivalent to 4 AS levels), then you may not have to pay tuition or exam fees.

If you are aged 24 or older and have not yet attained a Full Level 2 qualification (5 GCSEs 9-4/A*-C) then you may not have to pay tuition or exam fees if study will enable you to progress into work or you are receiving JSA, ESA (WRAG), Universal Credit-mandated training or are on a low income.

If you are aged 19 or older and wish to study for a Level 3 or higher qualification, you will normally have to pay fees for each academic year of a course, or if available you can apply for an Advanced Learner Loan. Advanced Learner Loans are in operation to provide financial support to adults who wish to study at Level 3 or higher. The loans are managed by the Student Loans Company who also manage the HE loans system. Further information can be found on the Student Loans Company website: www.slc.co.uk.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Support may be available through a Bursary or other funding support scheme, contact our Student Bursary Adviser for more detailed information relevant to you.

Households receiving a low income and/or are in receipt of a means-tested benefit may be eligible for financial support. Application forms are available at www.esc.ac.uk or from our Client Services team who will assess your application to see if you are eligible for financial support. This could include help with childcare costs, course equipment/resource fees, educational visits, lunches at college, travel expenses and uniforms.

FUNCTIONAL SKILLS AND GCSE ENGLISH OR MATHS

If you meet the residency criteria, these courses are offered free, except where you already hold a pass grade at the same or higher level in the subject that you wish to study.

OTHER PAYMENT OPTIONS

Instalment plans for courses over £400 are available for over 18s, please contact Client Services for details.

Choosing Your Course

ENGLISH FOR SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES (ESOL)

If English isn't your first language, ESOL courses cover speaking, listening, reading, writing, vocabulary, punctuation and grammar. You will be assessed before starting your course to ensure you are placed on the right course level.

APPRENTICESHIP AND NVQ

An NVQ is an industry related qualification that you may study at College or at work as part of an Apprenticeship. You will learn practical, work-related tasks to help you develop skills and knowledge to do a job effectively. You will be assessed on your skills and knowledge to see the areas that need to be developed to complete your qualification.

BTEC

BTEC Level 2 Diplomas and Extended Certificates enable you to progress into employment or study at the higher level of the Subsidiary Diploma, 90 Credit Diploma or Extended Diploma. The Extended Diploma is equivalent to 3 A-Levels and is a preferred route for many to University. All qualifications have been designed in collaboration with industry, to equip you with the skills and knowledge that employers are looking for. The qualifications offer a mix of theory and practice and will include an element of work experience or a work-related project. They can take the form of (or be part of) a technical certificate, one of the key components of an Apprenticeship.

The qualifications featured in this guide may be subject to change due to changes by awarding bodies or funding changes from the ESFA (Education & Skills Funding Agency). Please call the Client Services team on 01737 788444 if you need further information or guidance.

FUNCTIONAL SKILLS

Develop your skills in English and Maths in real life situations. Functional Skills are often a stepping stone to GCSEs and support progression to higher levels. You are eligible to study Functional Skills at College if you are:

- Over 16 years of age, have left compulsory full-time education or do not have an up-to-date English or Maths qualification at Level 2 (such as a GCSE)
- In addition to the above, if you are between the ages of 16-18 you are required to be taking a full-time course in order to study Functional Skills

GCSE

These are the main qualifications taken by 14 to 16 year olds, are highly valued by schools, colleges and employers and are useful whatever your future plans. Maths and English are particularly valued by employers and are important in enabling progression to higher levels.

Apprenticeships

An Apprenticeship gives you the chance to gain qualifications and work experience whilst earning a wage.

Intermediate Apprenticeships are equivalent to five good GCSE passes

Advanced Apprenticeships are equivalent to two A-Level passes

Higher Apprenticeships are equivalent to a Level 4 qualification or above

Degree Apprenticeships are equivalent to a Level 6 qualification or above

WHO CAN APPLY?

Anyone can apply for an Apprenticeship programme as long as they are aged 16+ at the start of their Apprenticeship programme. We can support you to find the right employer before you start an Apprenticeship.

WHAT'S INVOLVED?

Employers recognise and value an Apprenticeship as it is a nationally recognised programme and shows that you've been trained in the skills they need. Apprenticeships are designed by employers in the industry so they offer a structured programme that takes you through the skills needed to do a job well. Some of your training will be at college gaining the essential knowledge and skills relevant to your job role.



Meet Myles

Mechanical Engineering Level 4 Apprentice

Myles is working as a Mechanical Workshop Technician for the University of Surrey, and helped with the production of protective visors for frontline workers during the Coronavirus pandemic.

“We have a large workshop on campus and when we heard that the local hospitals were running low, we decided we would try and help by producing PPE for them. We have been working in shifts in order to minimise the amount of staff members having to travel to and from work at any one time. I was keen to do anything we possibly could in order to help the NHS because they are the main defence against this virus and the real heroes.”

Myles set up 3D printers, as a small scale production line, to create the visors and shields. Some of the visors then went to the Royal Surrey County Hospital, and others to local care homes.

1 Year / 144 UCAS Points (Grade D45)

Entry Requirements: GCSE grade 9-4 (A*-C) in English and Maths

Assessment: Continual assessment through a range of assignments

This course is designed for adults not already in possession of suitable Level 3 qualifications. The course is based around construction technology, site management and civil engineering professions. It is an approved route to higher level qualifications, training programmes, and University degrees within Engineering and Construction.

Entry Requirements: GCSE grade 9-4 (A*-C) in English and Maths

Assessment: Continual assessment through a range of assignments, exams and presentations

This course is designed for adults not already in possession of a suitable Level 3 qualification. It is an approved route to higher level qualifications, training programmes, and University degrees within the Sciences and other related professions.

- Chemistry
- Chemical bonding
- Biology
- Cell biology
- The human body

WHAT'S NEXT?

- A degree in Biomedical Sciences, Chemistry, Physics, Biology, Environmental Science, Forensic Science, Paramedic Science, Pharmacy, Food Science and Microbiology

ACCESS TO NURSING & HEALTH RELATED PROFESSIONS LEVEL 3

1 Year / 144 UCAS Points (Grade D45)

Entry Requirements: GCSE grade 9-4 (A*-C) in English and Maths

Assessment: Continual assessment through a range of assignments, research report, written and oral presentations

This course is designed for adults not already in possession of a suitable Level 3 qualification. It is an approved route to higher level qualifications, training programmes, and University degrees within Nursing and other health related professions.

- Biology
- Abnormal & cognitive psychology
- Human health and disease
- Psychology
- Understanding mental health

WHAT'S NEXT?

APPLIED SCIENCE LEVEL 2 EXTENDED CERTIFICATE

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE grade 9-3 (A*-D) including English, Maths and Science

Assessment: Coursework, practical assessments and external examinations

This is a practical, work-related course, developing the necessary skills, knowledge and understanding of applied science.

You'll develop a responsible and cooperative approach, often working in small groups, presenting your findings to the rest of the class.

You will also take part in work experience or a work based project.

WHAT'S INCLUDED?

- Scientific skills
- The living body
- Principles of Science
- Chemistry and our Earth
- English and Maths (if not already achieved at GCSE grade 9-4/A*-C)

WHAT'S NEXT?

- Applied Science Level 3 Extended Diploma
- Job roles could include Dental Laboratory Assistant, Healthcare Science Assistant, Laboratory Technician and Laboratory Assistant

Zakon Training ran a workshop at ESC on Criminology and Forensic Science for the Applied Science students. Paul, a retired officer from Humberside Police, provided the students with a crime to courtroom scenario of a homicide, which the students had to try and solve.

APPLIED SCIENCE LEVEL 3 EXTENDED DIPLOMA

2 Years / 168 UCAS Points (Grade D*D*D*)

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE grade 9-4 (A*-C) including English, Maths and Science or: BTEC Level 2 Technical in Laboratory Science/ BTEC NQF Level 2 Extended Certificate/BTEC QCF Level 2 Diploma Merit/Distinction and GCSE grade 9-4 (A*-C) in English, Maths and Science

Assessment: Coursework, practical assessments and external examinations

This is a theoretical, practical and work-related course, developing the necessary skills, knowledge and understanding for both biomedical and forensic sciences. This course will include relevant talks from industry professionals and visits to places of scientific interest to support your progression into a forensic or biomedical field.
