

Henry was awarded the Most Improved Student for his course for 2015.

He has had support from his tutors in managing his phonological processing and specific learning difficulties. As his course is exam driven, he was introduced to assistive technology (Read & Write Gold) and revision techniques that enabled him to keep up with his coursework and revision, as well as being able to use it as an aid during exams.

Henry has recently started using Dragon Naturally Speaking which allows him to dictate his notes as his poor fine motor skills affect his handwriting ability.

Henry has valued the help he has received and plans to progress to Level 4 AAT Accounting.

Additional Learning Support

DO YOU NEED EXTRA HELP WITH YOUR STUDIES?

Additional support can be provided to students who have a learning difficulty or disability. If you have a Statement of special need, a learning difficulty assessment or an Education Health Care Plan (EHCP) please provide this to us for our guidance on your needs.

We provide access to assistive technology and software which can help with typing, reading and research.

Our specialist tutors carry out assessments for exam concessions, dyslexia and dyscalculia and recommend strategies to enable you to make independent progress in learning.

We employ specialist staff to support those with hearing or visual impairments and speech and language needs.

Students requiring additional support will often be allocated a specific Learning Support Assistant to work with them ensuring consistency throughout the College day.

Twice a week we hold a successful autistic spectrum support group where students socialise and try out new activities.

Enrichment

We offer a wide variety of activities in which you can participate outside of your academic timetable. Enrichment is about meeting new friends, developing new skills and getting the best out of your College experience.

We have a dedicated College Sport Maker who organises a wide range of sports activities to get everyone healthy and having some fun. Taking place at lunchtimes and in the early evenings, the programme is free and everyone is welcome; no matter what your experience, ability, gender or age! The programme has included Football, Basketball, Archery, Touch Rugby, Legs, Bums & Tums and many more activities.

1. **Choose Your Course**

First think about your personal ambitions, your abilities and your preferences. Have a good look through this guide and see what's on offer

2. **Come & See the College**

Attend an Open Event to see the facilities, meet staff members and ask any questions that you may have

3. **Apply For Your Place**

Once you've found your course fill in an application form and return it to ESC. Application forms can be found in the back of this guide or you can apply online at www.esc.ac.uk

4. **Information, Advice & Guidance Interview**

You will then be invited in to ESC for an information and advice session where we will discuss every aspect of the course/s you have chosen. This is an important opportunity for you to make sure that this is the right course for you and for us to fully explain the details and requirements of your course

5. **The Offer**

We will confirm what we can offer you. If you are taking exams your place may be conditional upon you achieving certain grades. Adult students with appropriate qualifications are usually offered unconditional places

6. **Enrolment**

You will be invited to come and enrol at the College in the summer. If you didn't do as well as you hoped in your school exams - don't panic, we will work to offer you a more appropriate course, often leading to your first choice at a later date. If you did better than you expected, we will help you to progress directly onto a higher level

The guidance below refers to students who have been ordinarily resident in the UK or European Economic Area (EEA) for the past 3 years, if this is not the case please contact our Client Services team for advice.

Under 19?

- If you are under the age of 19 on 31 August 2016 and you meet the eligibility criteria your course is FREE
- You may be required to pay a resource fee and educational visit costs, however financial support is available for those who need it (subject to family income level)
- If you are under 16 years of age special arrangements have to be made and fees may be payable

19 and over?

Depending on the qualifications you have already gained tuition, resource and/or exam fees may be payable for your course.

- If you are under the age of 24 and have not yet attained a Full Level 2 qualification (5 GCSEs A*-C) or a Full Level 3 qualification (equivalent to 4 AS levels), then you may not have to pay tuition or exam fees
- If you are aged 24 or older and have not yet attained a Full Level 2 qualification (5 GCSEs A*-C) then you may not have to pay tuition or exam fees if it will enable you to move into work or progress into work and you are receiving JSA, ESA (WRAG) or Universal Credit-mandated training.
- If you are aged 24 or older and wish to study for a Level 3 or higher qualification, you will normally have to pay fees for each academic year of a course, or if available you can apply for a 24+ Advanced Learning Loan.

The 24+ Advanced Learning Loans are now in operation to provide financial support to adults who wish to study at Level 3 or higher. The loans are managed by the Student Loans Company who also manage the HE loans system. Further information can be found on the Student Loans Company website www.slc.co.uk.

Financial Support

If you need help with the cost of coming to College there may be support available through a College Bursary and other funding support schemes.

Application forms are available from Client Services who will assess your application and see if you are eligible for financial support. This could include help with:

- Childcare costs
- Course equipment
- Educational visits
- Lunches at College
- Travel expenses
- Uniforms

People in receipt of low incomes and a means tested benefit are most likely to be helped. Application forms are available from Client Services or at www.esc.ac.uk.

Basic Skills, Functional Skills & GCSE English or Maths

These courses are offered free, except where you already hold a GCSE grade C in the subject that you wish to study.

Benefits

If you are over 19, unemployed and in receipt of benefits please seek advice from the Client Services team on whether fees will be charged.

Bursaries

The bursary fund you are eligible for will be based on your age, which course you are studying, and your household income. Please contact Client Services for more detailed information relevant to you.

Course Levels, Qualifications & Entry Criteria

The qualifications within this guide may be subject to change due to changes by awarding bodies or funding changes from the EFA/ SFA (Education Funding Agency/Skills Funding Agency) therefore if you need any information or guidance regarding the qualifications framework please call Client Services on 01737 788444. The SFA funds post-18 education and the EFA 16-18 year old students. Not all qualifications in this book are funded by both agencies.

Qualification levels are recognised nationwide as part of the Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF) and everyone that studies a secondary, Further or Higher Education course will be awarded and qualified to a recognised standard. Most qualifications now fall within the QCF framework.

Functional Skills

Functional Skills qualifications help you to develop skills in English, Maths and Information & Communication Technology (ICT) in real life situations; and can be used to progress to GCSEs in these subjects or support progression to higher levels in vocational subjects. You can take a Functional Skills qualification if you are over 16 years of age, have left compulsory full-time education or do not have an up-to-date English or Maths qualification at Level 2 on the QCF (such as a GCSE). These are often a stepping stone to GCSE.

GCSEs

These are the main qualifications taken by 14 to 16 year olds. They are highly valued by schools, colleges and employers so will be useful whatever your future plans. Mathematics and English are particularly valued by employers and are important in enabling progression to higher levels whether academic or vocational.

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

If English isn't your first language, you can apply for a course to help you improve your English. ESOL courses cover speaking, listening, reading, writing, vocabulary, punctuation and grammar. There are courses at different levels, and we will help you find the right level for you. Visit www.esc.ac.uk for course details and for more information.

NVQ Diploma

If you are looking to gain a recognised qualification related to a particular industry or sector, an NVQ may be for you. You can study NVQs at college or work as part of an Apprenticeship.

NVQs are competence-based qualifications, which means that you learn practical, work-related tasks designed to help you develop the skills and knowledge to do a job effectively.

NVQs are based on national standards for various occupations. As you progress through the course, assessment of your skills and knowledge take place, so that you can see the areas that need to be developed to meet the standards. Taking an NVQ could be appropriate if you already have skills and want to improve them, or if you are starting from scratch. NVQs are based at Levels 1 to 5 on the Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF).

BTEC Awards, Certificates, Extended Certificates & Diplomas

BTEC Level 2 Diplomas and Extended Certificates enable you to progress onto employment or to study at the higher level of the Subsidiary Diploma, 90 Credit Diploma or Extended Diploma.

The Extended Diploma is equivalent to 3 A levels and is a preferred route for many to University. You can take one of these courses if you are interested in learning more about a particular sector or industry. All qualifications have been designed in collaboration with industry, to equip you with the skills and knowledge that employers are looking for.


The qualifications offer a mix of theory and practice and will include an element of work experience or a work-related project. They can take the form of (or be part of) a technical certificate, one of the key components of an Apprenticeship.

Technical Baccalaureate (TechBacc)

The TechBacc is an alternative to A-Level study. Full details can be seen on page 17.

16-19 Full-time Study Programmes

An individual Study Programme is in place for every 16-19 year old on a Full-time course at the College. The Programmes will include:

- A substantial academic or vocational qualification that provides a recognised route into a trade, profession or other form of employment, or access to a University or Higher Education course
- English and Maths where this has not been achieved at GCSE grade A*-C
- Work experience or internship that the College will plan and monitor or a work-related project, typically working from briefs set by local employers
- Group and one-to-one tutorials and other value-added activity
- A variety of enrichment activities including trips, visits and activities to enhance your CV

Whichever course you have selected to study will include most if not all of these five elements.

Who can apply?

At East Surrey College we offer Apprenticeship programmes to all age groups aged 16+, from school leavers to adults seeking a career change. You need to have a job to start an Apprenticeship and we can support you to find the right employer with all our Apprenticeship vacancies advertised on our website.

Apprenticeships are not just based on academic achievement. Practical skills and a passion to work in a particular area are of equal importance. If you do not have an Apprenticeship job lined up we can still support you in becoming an Apprentice through a Traineeship.

What's involved?

You work towards a nationally recognised vocational qualification. Employers all over the country recognise and value Apprenticeships as they show that you've been trained in the skills they need.

Apprenticeships are designed by employers in the industry so they offer a structured programme that takes you through the skills you need to do a job well. You will also spend time training off the job, at the College for example, studying for vocational qualifications.

What are the benefits?

Apprenticeships enable you to learn on the job, building up knowledge and skills, gaining qualifications and earning money, all at the same time. 95% of our Apprentices are kept on by their employers at the end of their placement in full-time permanent positions.

What levels are available?

- Intermediate Apprenticeships (equivalent to five good GCSE passes): Apprentices work towards their vocational qualifications, Functional Skills and a relevant technical certificate. These provide you with the skills you need for your chosen career and provides entry to an Advanced Apprenticeship.
- Advanced Apprenticeships (equivalent to two A level passes): Advanced Apprenticeships work towards a Level 3 qualification. To start this programme, you should ideally have five GCSEs (grade C or above) including Maths and English or have completed an Intermediate Apprenticeship; and be working in a supervisory or team leader role.
- Higher Apprenticeships (equivalent to a Level 4 or above qualification): This is an alternative to studying a degree or HND programme and focuses on professional qualifications.




Traineeships

Traineeships are a good option for young people who are not quite ready to start an Apprenticeship or for those that are motivated to find employment but who lack the skills and experience that employers are looking for. Progression from a Traineeship can include an Apprenticeship or gaining employment. Please see **page 76** for full details.

TechBaccs

An alternative to A-Level study, the TechBacc offers students a specialist high quality vocational qualification, ideal for progression on to a University course or employment.

Access to HE



The Access to HE Diploma qualification prepares students to study at degree level. These courses are designed for adults that are planning to go to University but do not currently hold a suitable Level 3 qualification.

The Access to HE Diploma is widely recognised by UK universities.

- a DBS check needs to be completed before you can commence your course. Therefore please submit your application as early as possible
- you will need to buy a uniform (polo shirt/fleece)
- you will need to pay for any trips and your DBS

This course is designed for adults not already in possession of a suitable Level 3 qualification. It is an approved route to higher level qualifications, training programmes, and University degrees within nursing and other health related professions.

- Human Biology
- Health Studies
- Sociology & Psychology of Health
- Mental Health

▷▷ **Further study:**

The Life Skills department promotes inclusion and personal development for students with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). We have a range of courses suited to all abilities which are particularly suitable for those who may not have had the opportunity to access a full range of GCSE or Functional Skills subjects in their previous schooling.

We recognise everyone has individual needs and abilities and we will work with you to meet the outcomes of your Education Health Care Plan (EHCP). We believe our students benefit from building on previous skills learnt to enable them to access the wider community which prepares them for the workplace and more independent living.

Students are placed on a course and depending on their prior attainment, often progress to a higher level over a two or three year period. Courses contain a variety of practical skills and academic subjects to ensure students are motivated to take on new challenges and ideas.

During an interview we will discuss your special needs and endeavour to meet them by providing appropriate specialist support and making reasonable adjustments where it is reasonably practical.

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
