Nealraj chose the College due to the smaller class sizes and learning support he was able to receive. He has ASD and came to the College from a specialist school for students with Speech, Language & Communication needs.

Nealraj attends the ASD Group twice a week and has 1:1 support as well as access to specialist software Read, Write Gold.

He has improved a great deal since being at the College, now travelling independently and making friends, many in the ASD group. He has participated in outings organised by students in the group as well as making suggestions for group activities.

Nealraj will be progressing on to study Theatre Arts: Prop Making & Special Effects Foundation Degree (FdA) in September.

Additional Learning Support

Do you need extra help with your studies?

Additional support can be provided to students who have a learning difficulty or disability. If you have an Education Health Care Plan (EHCP) please provide this to us for our guidance on your needs.

We provide access to assistive technology and software which can help with typing, reading and research.

Our specialist tutors carry out assessments for exam concessions, dyslexia and dyscalculia and recommend strategies to enable you to make independent progress in learning.

We employ specialist staff to support those with hearing or visual impairments and speech and language needs.

Students requiring additional support will often be allocated a specific Learning Support Assistant to work with them ensuring consistency throughout the College day.

Twice a week we hold a successful autistic spectrum support group where students socialise and try out new activities.

Michael helps to organise and run the Touch Tennis sessions. He frequently leads activities without the assistance of coaching staff as well as supporting as Assistant Football Coach.



Enrichment

We offer a wide variety of activities in which you can participate outside of your academic timetable. Enrichment is about meeting new friends, developing new skills and getting the best out of your College experience.

We have a dedicated College Sport Maker who organises a wide range of sports activities to get everyone healthy and having some fun. Taking place at lunchtimes and in the early evenings, the programme is free and everyone is welcome; no matter what your experience, ability, gender or age! The programme has included Football, Basketball, Archery, Touch Rugby and many more activities.

- > Become an Activity Champion - You can join the Enrichment team in creating the exciting sport and activity programme for students. It is a great opportunity to learn new skills whilst gaining free coaching qualifications to add to your CV or UCAS application, whilst having fun and motivating others.
- > Become a Student Ambassador - This is a voluntary role where you will be asked to attend various events such as open events, school fairs and school assemblies throughout the academic year. At these events you are there to promote the College to potential students for the next academic year and tell them about your course and student life at the College. It will also look good on your CV and UCAS applications.

Employment

We work closely with local businesses to ensure our courses are relevant and current to industry. Students take part in work experience, giving them real experience of the world of work.

You will then be invited in to ESC for an information and advice session where we will discuss every aspect of the course/s you have chosen. This is an important opportunity for you to make sure that this is the right course for you and for us to fully explain the details and requirements of your course

The Offer

We will confirm what we can offer you. If you are taking exams your place may be conditional upon you achieving certain grades. Adult students with appropriate qualifications are usually offered unconditional places

6

Enrolment

You will be invited to come and enrol at the College in the summer. If you didn't do as well as you hoped in your school exams - don't panic, we will work to offer you a more appropriate course, often leading to your first choice at a later date. If you did better than you expected, we will help you to progress directly onto a higher level

The guidance below refers to students who have been ordinarily resident in the UK or European Economic Area (EEA) for the past 3 years, if this is not the case please contact our Client Services team for advice.

Under 19?

- > If you are under the age of 19 on 31 August 2017 and you meet the eligibility criteria your course is FREE
- > You may be required to pay a resource fee and educational visit costs, however financial support is available for those who need it (subject to family income level)
- > If you are under 16 years of age special arrangements have to be made and fees may be payable

19 and over?

Depending on the qualifications you have already gained tuition and/or exam fees may be payable for your course.

- > If you are under the age of 24 and have not yet attained a Full Level 2 qualification (5 GCSEs A*-C/9-4) or a Full Level 3 qualification (equivalent to 4 AS levels), then you may not have to pay tuition or exam fees
- > If you are aged 24 or older and have not yet attained a Full Level 2 qualification (5 GCSEs A*-C/9-4) then you may not have to pay tuition or exam fees if it will enable you to move into work or progress into work or you are receiving JSA, ESA (WRAG) or Universal Credit-mandated training.
- > If you are aged 19 or older and wish to study for a Level 3 or higher qualification, you will normally have to pay fees for each academic year of a course, or if available you can apply for an Advanced Learner Loan.

The Advanced Learner Loans are now in operation to provide financial support to adults who wish to study at Level 3 or higher. The loans are managed by the Student Loans Company who also manage the HE loans system. Further information can be found on the Student Loans Company website www.slc.co.uk.

Financial Support

If you need help with the cost of coming to College there may be support available through a College Bursary and other funding support schemes.

The bursary fund you are eligible for will be based on your age, which course you are studying, and your household income. Please contact the Student Bursary Adviser for more detailed information relevant to you.

Households receiving a low income and/or are in receipt of a means tested benefit may be eligible for financial support. Basic Skills, Functional Skills & GCSE English or Maths

These courses are offered free, except where you already hold a GCSE grade C in the subject that you wish to study.

If you are over 19, unemployed and in receipt of benefits please seek advice from the Client Services team on whether fees will be charged.

- > Instalment Plans for courses over £400 are available for over 18s, please contact Client Services for details.

Course Levels, Qualifications & Entry Criteria

The qualifications featured in this guide may be subject to change due to changes by awarding bodies or funding changes from the EFA/SFA (Education Funding Agency/Skills Funding Agency).

Functional Skills

Functional Skills qualifications help you to develop skills in English, Maths and Information & Communication Technology (ICT) in real life situations.

You can take a Functional Skills qualification if you are over 16 years of age, have left compulsory full-time education or do not have an up-to-date English or Maths qualification at Level 2 (such as a GCSE). Functional Skills are often a stepping stone to GCSE and support progression to higher levels in vocational subjects.

GCSEs

These are the main qualifications taken by 14 to 16 year olds. They are highly valued by schools, colleges and employers so will be useful whatever your future plans. Maths and English are particularly valued by employers and are important in enabling progression to higher levels whether academic or vocational.

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

If English isn't your first language, you can apply for a course to help you improve your English. ESOL courses cover speaking, listening, reading, writing, vocabulary, punctuation and grammar. You will be assessed before starting your course in order to ensure you are placed on the right level course.

NVQ Diploma

An NVQ is a recognised qualification related to a particular industry or sector. You can study NVQs at College or work as part of an Apprenticeship.

You will learn practical, work-related tasks designed to help you develop the skills and knowledge to do a job effectively. You will be assessed on your skills and knowledge so that you can see the areas that need to be developed to complete your qualification.

Taking an NVQ could be appropriate if you already have skills and want to improve them, or if you are starting from scratch. NVQs are based at Levels 1 to 5 on the Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF).

BTEC Awards, Certificates, Extended Certificates, Diplomas & Extended Diplomas

BTEC Level 2 Diplomas and Extended Certificates enable you to progress into employment or to study at the higher level of the Subsidiary Diploma, 90 Credit Diploma or Extended Diploma.

The Extended Diploma is equivalent to 3 A-Levels and is a preferred route for many to University. All qualifications have been designed in collaboration with industry, to equip you with the skills and knowledge that employers are looking for.

The qualifications offer a mix of theory and practice and will include an element of work experience or a work-related project. They can take the form of (or be part of) a technical certificate, one of the key components of an Apprenticeship.

Technical Baccalaureate (TechBacc)

An alternative to A-Level study, TechBacc students will study Level 3 Maths and complete an Extended Project in addition to their Level 3 Extended Diploma. Courses that are also available as a TechBacc are shown within the following course pages.

16-19 Full-time Study Programmes

An individual Study Programme is in place for every 16-19 year old on a Full-time course at the College. The Programmes include:

- > A substantial academic or vocational qualification that provides a recognised route into a trade, profession or other form of employment, or access to a University or Higher Education course
- > English and Maths where this has not been achieved at GCSE grade A*-C (9-4)
- > Work experience or internship that the College will plan and monitor or a work-related project, typically working from briefs set by local employers
- > Group and one-to-one tutorials and other value-added activities
- > A variety of enrichment activities including trips, visits and activities to enhance your CV

Whichever course you have selected to study will include most if not all of these five elements.

Traineeships

Traineeships are a good option for young people who are not quite ready to start an Apprenticeship or for those that are motivated to find employment but who lack the skills and experience that employers are looking for. Progression from a Traineeship can include an Apprenticeship or gaining employment. Please see **page 73** for full details.

Who can apply?

Apprenticeship programmes are offered to all age groups aged 16+. You need to have a job to start an Apprenticeship and we can support you to find the right employer with all our Apprenticeship vacancies advertised on our website.

Equal importance is placed on academic achievement as well as practical skills and a passion to work in a particular area. If you do not have an Apprenticeship job lined up we can still support you in becoming an Apprentice through a Traineeship.

What's involved?

You work towards a nationally recognised vocational qualification. Employers all over the country recognise and value Apprenticeships as it shows that you've been trained in the skills they need.


Apprenticeships are designed by employers in the industry so they offer a structured programme that takes you through the skills you need to do a job well. Some of your training will be at college gaining the essential knowledge and skills relevant to your job role.

What are the benefits?

Apprenticeships enable you to learn on the job, building up knowledge and skills, gaining qualifications and earning money, all at the same time. 95% of our Apprentices are kept on by their employers at the end of their placement in full-time permanent positions.

What levels are available?

- Intermediate Apprenticeships (equivalent to five good GCSE passes): Apprentices work towards their vocational qualifications, Functional Skills and a relevant technical certificate. These provide you with the skills you need for your chosen career and provides entry to an Advanced Apprenticeship.
- Advanced Apprenticeships (equivalent to two A-Level passes): Advanced Apprenticeships work towards a Level 3 qualification. To start this programme, you should ideally have five GCSEs (grade A*-C/9-4) including Maths and English or have completed an Intermediate Apprenticeship.
- Higher Apprenticeships (equivalent to a Level 4 or above qualification): This combines higher level qualifications such as HNC or Foundation Degrees with a work-based qualification such as an NVQ.



DYLAN ENGLAND
ACCESS TO NURSING

Dylan succeeded in being one of only six Access to HE students from across the country to win an award at the Keith Fletcher Memorial Access to HE Student Prizes Ceremony at The Palace of Westminster.

Dylan won the £500 prize for Outstanding Commitment to Study. He was presented with his certificate and cash prize in the Jubilee Room in the Palace of Westminster.

The winners were taken on a tour of the Palace including a chance to enter the House of Lords. Dylan, along with the other award winners, was also able to watch a debate from the Gallery in the House of Commons.

The Access to HE Diploma qualification prepares students to study at degree level. These courses are designed for adults that are planning to go to University but do not currently hold a suitable Level 3 qualification.

The Access to HE Diploma is widely recognised by UK universities.

1 Year 144 UCAS Points (Grade D45)

Entry Requirements: GCSE grade A*-C (9-4) in English & Maths

Assessment: Continual assessment through a range of assignments

What will I do on this course?

This course is designed for adults not already in possession of suitable Level 3 qualifications. The course is based around construction technology, site management and civil engineering professions. It is an approved route to higher level qualifications, training programmes, and University degrees within Engineering & Construction.

Some of the topics that you will explore include:

- Construction
- Civil Engineering
- Electronics & Materials
- Maths & Science
- Modern Engineering

Further study:

- A degree in construction and civil engineering

Job/career opportunities:

- Employment in the construction industry in roles such as construction management or civil engineering

Entry Requirements: GCSE grade A*-C (9-4) in English & Maths

What will I do on this course?

This course is designed for adults not already in possession of a suitable Level 3 qualification. It is an approved route to higher level qualifications, training programmes, and University degrees within nursing and other health related professions.

Some of the topics that you will explore include:

- Human Biology
- Health Studies
- Sociology & Psychology of Health
- Mental Health

Further study:

- A degree in nursing or other health professions such as occupational therapy, physiotherapy, radiography, paramedics, midwifery and podiatry

Job/career opportunities:

- Employment in the health sector, including hospitals, nursing homes and community care

Access to Science

1 Year 144 UCAS Points (Grade D45)

Entry Requirements: GCSE grade A*-C (9-4) in English, Maths & Science

Assessment: Coursework

What will I do on this course?

This course is designed for adults not already in possession of a suitable Level 3 qualification. It is an approved route to higher level qualifications, training programmes, and University degrees within the sciences and other related professions.

Some of the topics that you will explore include:

- Biology
- Chemistry
- Physics
- Maths

Further study:

- A degree in biomedical sciences, chemistry, physics, biology, environmental science, forensic science, paramedic science, pharmacy, food science and microbiology

Job/career opportunities:

- Employment in a science based profession such as biomedical science, pharmacology and dietetics

1 Year

This course is aimed at East Surrey College students who have completed Entry Level and Level 1 courses and need support to transition to voluntary or paid work.

As part of this internship, you will gain real world experience in the workplace two days a week as well as developing individual employability and independence skills whilst at College one day a week.

Due to her mature attitude she has also had the opportunity to be a Trainee Learning Support Assistant in English class, supporting her peers in their studies.

She has also engaged in work experience with the YMCA, working on their Waves Programme which is designed to support those with mental health needs. This has provided her with excellent experience and she has now started an Apprenticeship in Childcare with the YMCA.

EMPLOYABILITY/WORK SKILLS

When Harry first joined East Surrey College he was a shy unconfident young man with communication difficulties which meant it had been hard for him to make solid friendships at his last school. Harry has thrived both socially and academically, becoming a popular, bubbly and more confident young person.

He has enjoyed doing hairdressing as well as developing other skills such as cooking (particularly apple crumble) and gardening.

As part of the enterprise project on his course Harry participated in selling cards as well as helping the Marketing Department in preparing visitor packs for Open Events. Harry has also maintained a part-time job at a local supermarket.

Harry won the Positive Attitude Award at the 2016 End of Year Awards, and has gained the skills and confidence this year to progress onto a Level 1 mainstream course in September.

Life Skills - SEND

The Life Skills-SEND department promotes inclusion and personal development for students with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). We have a range of courses suited to all abilities which are particularly suitable for those who may not have had the opportunity to access a full range of GCSE or Functional Skills subjects in their previous schooling.

We recognise everyone has individual needs and abilities and we will work with you to meet the outcomes of your Education Health Care Plan (EHCP). We believe our students benefit from building on previous skills learnt to enable them to access the wider community which prepares them for the workplace and more independent living.

Students are placed on a course and depending on their prior attainment, often progress to a higher level over a two or three year period. Courses contain a variety of practical skills and academic subjects to ensure students are motivated to take on new challenges and ideas in preparation for adulthood.

During your interview we will discuss your special needs and endeavour to meet them by providing appropriate specialist support and making reasonable adjustments where it is reasonably practical.

Life Skills - SEND students created and sold a range of handmade cards over the course of the year for special occasions such as Mothers' Day and Christmas.

Promoting Independence

1 or 2 Years

Entry Requirements: Interview and specialist assessment

Assessment: Coursework

What will I do on this course?

Students will study a range of units to enhance their personal progress and independence. You will work with lecturers to set relevant individual targets and to work on your own development for both academic and personal progress. Students will work on personal skills such as communication, behaviour, confidence, keeping safe and engaging with others. Embedded functional skills including Literacy, Numeracy and ICT will be included within sessions and taught in an inclusive practical way.

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
