NEED EXTRA HELP WITH YOUR STUDIES?

Additional support can be provided if you have a learning difficulty or disability. If you have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) please provide this so that we can support your needs.

UNDER 19?

If you are under the age of 19 on 31 August 2019 and you meet the eligibility criteria your course is FREE.

You may be required to pay a resource fee and educational visit costs, however financial support is available for those who need it (subject to family income level).

19 AND OVER?

Depending on the qualifications you have already gained, tuition and/or exam fees may be payable.

If you are under the age of 24 and have not attained a Full Level 2 qualification (5 GCSEs 9-4/A*-C) or a Full Level 3 qualification (equivalent to 4 AS levels), then you may not have to pay tuition or exam fees.

If you are aged 24 or older and have not yet attained a Full Level 2 qualification (5 GCSEs 9-4/A*-C) then you may not have to pay tuition or exam fees if study will enable you to progress into work or you are receiving JSA, ESA (WRAG) or Universal Credit-mandated training.

If you are aged 19 or older and wish to study for a Level 3 or higher qualification, you will normally have to pay fees for each academic year of a course, or, if available you can apply for an Advanced Learner Loan.

Advanced Learner Loans are now in operation to provide financial support to adults who wish to study at Level 3 or higher. The loans are managed by the Student Loans Company who also manage the HE loans system. Further information can be found on the Student Loans Company website: www.slc.co.uk.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Support may be available through a Bursary or other funding support scheme, contact our Student Bursary Adviser for more detailed information relevant to you.

Households receiving a low income and/or are in receipt of a means-tested benefit may be eligible for financial support. Application forms are available at www.esc.ac.uk or from our Client Services team who will assess your application to see if you are eligible for financial support. This could include help with: childcare costs, course equipment/resource fees, educational visits, lunches at college, travel expenses and uniforms.

BASIC SKILLS, FUNCTIONAL SKILLS AND GCSE ENGLISH OR MATHS

These courses are offered free, except where you already hold a GCSE grade 9-4 (A*-C) in the subject that you wish to study.

Instalment plans for courses over £400 are available for over 18s, please contact Client Services for details.

Choose a course that is right for you

The qualifications featured in this guide may be subject to change due to changes by awarding bodies or funding changes from the ESFA (Education & Skills Funding Agency). Please speak with the Client Services team on 01737 788444 if you need further information or guidance.

FUNCTIONAL SKILLS

Develop your skills in English and Maths in real life situations. You can take a Functional Skills qualification if you are over 16 years of age, have left compulsory full-time education or do not have an up-to-date English or Maths qualification at Level 2 (such as a GCSE). Functional Skills are often a stepping stone to GCSEs and support progression to higher levels.

GCSEs

The main qualifications taken by 14 to 16 year olds. Highly valued by schools, colleges and employers and useful whatever your future plans. Maths and English are particularly valued by employers and are important in enabling progression to higher levels.

ENGLISH FOR SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES (ESOL)

If English isn't your first language, ESOL courses cover speaking, listening, reading, writing, vocabulary, punctuation and grammar. You will be assessed before starting your course to ensure you are placed on the right level course.

APPRENTICESHIPS AND NVQs

An NVQ is an industry related qualification that you can study at College or at work as part of an Apprenticeship.

You will learn practical, work-related tasks to help you develop skills and knowledge to do a job effectively. You will be assessed on your skills and knowledge to see the areas that need to be developed to complete your qualification.

Apprenticeships and NVQs are delivered at Levels 1 to 5 on the Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF).

BTECs

BTEC Level 2 Diplomas and Extended Certificates enable you to progress into employment or study at the higher level of the Subsidiary Diploma, 90 Credit Diploma or Extended Diploma.

The Extended Diploma is equivalent to 3 A-Levels and is a preferred route for many to University. All qualifications have been designed in collaboration with industry, to equip you with the skills and knowledge that employers are looking for.

The qualifications offer a mix of theory and practice and will include an element of work experience or a work-related project. They can take the form of (or be part of) a technical certificate, one of the key components of an Apprenticeship.



WHO CAN APPLY?

Anyone aged 16+ can apply for an Apprenticeship programme. We can support you to find the right employer before you start an Apprenticeship.

WHAT'S INVOLVED?

You will work towards a nationally recognised vocational qualification. Employers recognise and value an Apprenticeship as it shows that you've been trained in the skills they need.

Apprenticeships are designed by employers in the industry so they offer a structured programme that takes you through the skills needed to do a job well. Some of your training will be at College gaining the essential knowledge and skills relevant to your job role.

WHAT LEVELS ARE AVAILABLE?

Intermediate Apprenticeships
equivalent to five good GCSE passes

Advanced Apprenticeships

Higher Apprenticeships

Entry Requirements: GCSE grade 9-4 (A*-C) in English and Maths

Assessment: Continual assessment through a range of assignments

WHY STUDY THIS COURSE?

This course is designed for adults not already in possession of suitable Level 3 qualifications. The course is based around construction technology, site management and civil engineering professions. It is an approved route to higher level qualifications, training programmes, and University degrees within Engineering and Construction.




